



MANUFACTURED DWELLING & CABANA PLACEMENT

Permit Fees and Guidelines

EFFECTIVE July 1, 2008

This is a guideline to assist the applicant in understanding the steps needed to obtain a manufactured dwelling placement permit. In the processing of the application, the applicant will be asked to obtain approval from various departments, divisions and entities within the county. There may also be additional permits required that are associated with the placement of a Manufactured Dwelling. The applicant should check with the following departments, divisions and entities within the county for any additional requirements, restrictions and/or permits.

The Manufactured Dwelling and Cabana placement permit includes electrical feeder, water and sewer lines within 30 feet of the perimeter of the unit, all cross over connections and slab, runners or foundation (when in compliance with the Oregon Manufactured Dwelling and Park Specialty Code (OMDPSC)).

Land Use Approval is required for the use (i.e. a permanent structure or a temporary dwelling for care). Applications will be reviewed for set back requirements, flood plain, greenway, special district's, and geotechnical report's for steep slopes or slide areas, etc. These review may result in additional permits.

If there is no driveway access or repairs / changes are needed to the existing driveway access, a separate driveway permit will be required.

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The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners adopted an ordinance to administer Transportation System Development Charges (TSDC). The fee, based on the number of vehicle trips a particular land use generates, is set to cover the cost of transportation facilities needed to serve the new or expanded development and the people who will occupy or use the development. The Parks System Development (PSDC) fee is collected on any new dwelling units created within the North Clackamas Park & Recreation District. This fee helps pay a portion of the costs associated with building capital facilities.

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Soils / Septic 503-742-4740

If you have an existing septic system and any of the following situations apply, the system may need to be analyzed under an existing system review to determine its functionality:

- Temporary Dwelling for Care / Health hardship (applicant should apply for Existing System Review Permit at the same time as making application with Planning Division for a Temporary Dwelling for Care).
- Increasing the number of bedrooms (i.e., replacing a two bedroom home with a three or four bedroom home).
- Existing system has not been in use within five years of its completion.

An existing system review may show a need for repairs, modifications, or replacement of your septic system. A separate septic permit is required for the repair, modification, or replacement of the septic system. To install a new septic system, you will need a Soils Evaluation Study first. This will determine whether the property can support a septic system. Check with the soils section of the Water Environment Service Department on these matters.

In some cases, a permit for erosion control will be required when setting up a new home, or building an accessory structure. Please check with the department of Water Environment Services (503) 742-4567
