

Pedestrian/Bike Advisory Committee Meeting
July 8, 2008 – Sunnybrook Center Auditorium

Members Present: Del Scharffenberg, Peter Goodkin, Dale Guenther and Sherri Dow.

Minutes: Susan asked that Marmot Dam reference in the May 6, 2008 minutes be changed from damn to dam. The March and May (as corrected) 2008 minutes were unanimously approved.

Public Comment: Dick indicated that the Clackamas River Road has been paved and widened (about 1' on each side). He also talked about the Boring Farmers Market bike ride coming up.

Del talked about the Harmony Rd. project and that it is contentious.

Bike Map Latest Draft Review

Scott showed a mock-up of the map. Committee members asked that we get rid of the brown and maroon colors on the cover. They thought lighter and brighter colors should be used for the cover. Some members thought that too much hill shade would take away from what we are trying to represent – the bike routes. Scott explained that colors are not accurate on the mock-up map and that the actual colors will be lighter and brighter.

Committee comments:

- asked staff to look into increasing the size of the urban map inset; consider decreasing 'white' space between recreation rides and increasing size of urban map, also consider decreasing big ride (Stafford Triangle Romp) by 30%
- salmon color roads are too close in color to the red color roads
- Peter suggested the Molalla River Corridor window needs to 'pop out' more; maybe use white border around the box.

Scott suggested getting a better draft of the map for committee members to review because the mock-up from Turtle Dove was not representative of the actual map. Staff will try to get a better draft and mail copies to the committee.

ODOT Grant Application

Lori indicated that the two projects under consideration include improvements along SE 122nd south of Sunnyside Rd to about the high school and a 6' wide shoulder along SE Linwood. There was discussion among the committee members on these projects. Several members said to submit an application for the project that will most likely receive funding.

Regional Transportation Plan Metro RTP Bike Plan

Lori showed the members the draft map of the RTP that includes bike route classifications. She noted that the RTP is in the earlier stages of review and that there will be more opportunities for review and comments sometime in the fall.

The draft map includes potential bike routes and trails.

Suggested agenda items for the next meeting include: Tri-Met and the I-205 bike path Sunrise Corridor Update from Ron Weinman or Larry Conrad; road sweeping.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40 pm.
